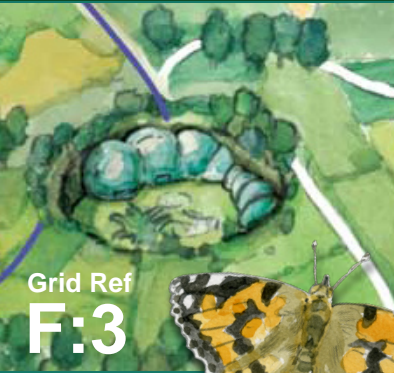

Outside in the landscaped grounds you will find tea, lavender, sunflowers and hemp. Eden is a place to tell a hundred plant stories, from cocoa and coffee to bananas and rubber. From plants and medicine to plants in construction. From paper and wine and from perfume to brewing.



In order to ensure there is something new to see each time you visit, we have developed a fantastic programme of seasonal events. From the brilliant displays of bulbs in our Spring Collection, to the family fun in summers' Survival Challenge and the sparkling ice rink in our winter festival A Time of Gifts; there's always something different to see and do!
